Re: City of Chandler Anti-Meth Ordinance to Take Effect in April

To Whom It May Concern:

We are sending this letter to remind you that Chandler City Ordinance #3753, relating to the sale of products containing ephedrine or pseudoephedrine, will go into effect on Wednesday, April 12, 2006. The ordinance, approved unanimously by the City Council in January, will affect all retail sales of products that are commonly used in the production of methamphetamine.

Retailers will be required to keep products containing ephedrine or pseudoephedrine behind store counters or otherwise inaccessible without the assistance of a store employee.

A person making a retail sale of a product containing ephedrine or pseudoephedrine shall require acceptable photo identification from the purchaser and shall record the purchaser's name, date of birth, address, quantity of ephedrine or pseudoephedrine product purchased, transaction date and the initials of the seller. A current driver's license, or a picture identification card or document issued by a governmental entity are considered acceptable identification. Under the terms of the ordinance, the records shall only be disclosed to the operator and employees of the retail establishment and law enforcement officials. Retailers are required to retain the records for a period of 180 days and make the records available for inspection by law enforcement officials.
